Life cycle of the Emerald Ash Borer



Emerald Ash Borer.

Female ash borers lay 60-90 eggs on or just under the bark of an ash tree.



Tree damage examples.

Adults, which can fly, then seek out new trees, and the process begins again.



Just how extensive the damage can become from Emerald Ash Borers.

After hatching, the larvae bore into the tree layers just below the bark to feed. They remain there for the winter, then pupate in the spring.



Borer holes on an Ash tree from a borer.

The adults chew a telltale D-shaped exit hole in the bark.
